A Message from Administration:

Greetings Sanborn,

If you can believe it, graduation and all the end of year events are here! I wanted to make sure that you all have the information. I have included a link <u>HERE</u> to the live document with the list of events. This information has also been sent via email and School Messenger (I do not want anyone to miss it). A few things to note:

- Seniors need to have all obligations fulfilled before receiving their cap and gown. This includes:
 - All athletic uniforms and equipment returned (with the exception of any spring sports still in season).
 - SCOIR updated for the school counseling department.
 - Lunch balance paid in full.
 - All library books/materials returned and/or paid for.
 - Chromebook returned or purchased can be purchased for \$20.
 - All dues paid.
- In the event of inclement weather, graduation will be held <u>indoors</u> in the gymnasium. Each student will receive 6 tickets. Tickets will be given out when students receive their cap and gown on June 5th <u>(tickets are only needed if graduation is indoors)</u>. Additional guests will be able to sit in the auditorium to watch the live broadcast. The call will be made on Wednesday, June 7th.
- Class day is open to families. If it is outside, then you do not need to sign in with the main office. If it is indoors, you will need to sign in.
