Greetings Sanborn Community!



Career Connections for Juniors

Is your junior struggling to identify what they hope to pursue after high school? Do they have questions about what they might be good at doing for a career? We will be offering the ASVAB exam in December for all juniors. This assessment used to be used as a test only for the military but it is so much more. Similar to the SAT which breaks the score down into subject areas, the ASVAB also breaks the score down but then links those skills to a career profile. After students receive their score reports, they will meet with a member of the counseling team to explore the career connections. Students will see their pattern of strengths and weaknesses and the careers, industries, colleges and majors connected with those patterns. As a counseling team, we use the ASVAB scores to kick off our career exploration with juniors in the spring. We strongly encourage all juniors to sit for the exam. The ones who have taken the exam found the information in their portals to be really helpful in identifying paths they may want to explore. Free and Reduced Lunch Information:



The school district is facing a demographic change. Historically, participation in free and reduced meal prices has hovered between 14 and 16 percent. Our most recent year, participation has declined to 7 percent. We continue to have food insecurity for some of our students, which has a detrimental effect on student learning and achievement.

With the help of the School Board, we have identified two areas that can have a significant impact on resolving food insecurities, as follows:

- 1. The School Board approved a "Meal Assistance Program" that receives donated funds to be spent purchasing food for students who do not otherwise qualify for free and reduced meals. To date, the program has received \$1,240.
 - a. Donations can be accepted by mail at 51 Church Street, PO Box 429, Kingston, NH 03848.
 - b. Students in need of meal assistance should speak with their school counselor or school
- 2. Families can apply for free and reduced meal prices. Applications can be obtained at the main office of each school or online by CLICKING HERE.
 - a. Oualified families will receive free or reduced meal prices, according to their household income.
 - b. The District will receive additional state aid for "adequate education" and federal grant funding for additional reading and math assistance.

It has been a busy fall here at Sanborn for the Sanborn Seminary Trustee Grant Recipients. Each group has been busy planning for a culminating event and maintaining projects thanks to the Sanborn Seminary Trustees. Here are the updates:



"Getting to the Y" - Mr. Parker, Mrs. Scott and the SRHS Youth in **Action Organization**

The Youth In Action Club has been honing their marketing skills in crafting messaging to meet different audiences in the Sanborn community. Joining other area students later this month at a peer leadership retreat, they will be bringing a united, statewide campaign to reduce substance misuse and other dangerous activities amongst teens. Here is what the students have to say -"Learning how to make videos and digital marketing tools is helping us to bring our prevention message to more people!" "I can't wait to meet with other groups of high school students to collaborate later this month!"

The Sanborn Submariners

The students have been working hard toward the first step of the Sanborn Submariners project, which is earning their scuba diving certification. 11 students earning their scuba certification in November! The students have also been brainstorming ideas for a new submarine to race in June 2025. The students incorporate skills from math, physics and science classes. Other students have been gathering pictures and videos to incorporate into a new Sanborn Submariners website to highlight the team, the school, and our donor sponsors. The team will be touring the UNH Mechanical Engineering and Ocean Engineering programs in December 2023, and scuba diving in the UNH Ocean Engineering tank with the original submarine in February 2024. The tank visit will give the students the opportunity to better understand how the submarine works and aerodynamics. The students have been very excited to be participating in the scuba certification process! Many of the students pushed themselves outside of their comfort zone





to participate in the scuba certification process. The students all agree that this project is a unique experience that presents many different learning opportunities!

Music Program Artist in Residence

From Band: We have started bringing in our artists in residence. So far we have had 4 different musicians come in and are working on another 2 to start soon! The kids are excited to work with these wonderful musicians and are constantly asking when they're next coming in. The artists in residence are working with instrument sections for our upcoming December concert as well as one-on-one coaching for upcoming auditions for All-State.

From Chorus: Vocal coach Christina DeMaio has been in 3 times already, and I am convinced that her expertise contributed to sophomore River Defeo's acceptance into the NHMEA Jazz All State Festival taking place this February. Here is a message from River:



I was tasked with explaining what Ms. DeMaio has done to help me with my success as a musician, as a singer, and as a performer. She is a wonderful and talented teacher to work with and always has a way of helping with issues I encounter. I have worked with her on some of the most intense music I have been given for festivals such as NHMEAs Classical Mixed Choir, Plymouth State's All New England Choral Festival, Audition material for a plethora of honors choirs and chamber ensembles, and more! She has always found ways to help me work through hardships in music and has encouraged me to have takeaways from my mistakes.

Beyond just lessons on the music on the page, she has taught me lessons on sight-reading, scatting, audition preparation, audition confidence, and tips on the differences between singing solo and ensembles. These are lessons that you don't often get in a

regular choir class, because there isn't enough time to teach them, and usually not enough kids who are interested. Having the opportunity to have one-on-one time and small group lessons with her has allowed me to learn more than I ever could about becoming a better overall musician.

I'm so glad I have the opportunity to express my gratitude about her to you all, as I feel a student's perspective is one of the most telling things you can hear about something happening in the school, and I hope you take my words to heart. She has been a huge part of my learning in the Sanborn Music Department, and I sincerely hope that I continue to get to work with her throughout my time at Sanborn Regional High School.




Join the SRHS Ski Club!


