NH SAS Testing Coming in May - Per State law, all NH schools are required to assess students using a standardized assessment. Sanborn Regional High School Student Dress Code

Acceptable headwear that does not cover face


All clothing must be free of images and language that are inappropriate, hateful, promote illegal substances, weapons, or violence

Undergarments should NOT be visible

The entire area from armpit to mid-thigh should be covered (Any see-through materials and rips should NOT be in this area)

Certain activities, events, and courses may require a variation of the dress code.

Upper body garments must have straps

Personal grooming should not take place in the classroom or hallways; this includes spraying fragrances. Personal grooming in the restroom should be limited.

Dress Code Reminder - As the weather begins to get warmer and we tackle the last quarter of the year, the administration would like to extend a friendly reminder about the school dress code. Please see the image below and reference the school policies in the student handbook for student expectations on how to properly dress for school. The entire area from armpit to mid-thigh should be covered; any see-through materials and rips should NOT be in this area. Undergarments should not be visible. Please help us maintain an environment conducive to learning and help our students prepare for the next chapter in their lives whether it be the workforce, military, college, or wherever else their ambitions take them by practicing discipline in dressing for school so they are dressed for success and ready to take on the world!






Students violating the dress code will receive a warning and be asked to change. If a change of clothes cannot be brought, the incident will be documented in disciplinary records and a second violation will result in further disciplinary action. Parents and guardians will not be called regarding dress code violations but will receive an email by

the end of the school day the violation occurred. Responses to dress code violations are restorative. Students are given an opportunity to self-correct or get parental support when they are not following the dress code.

For students who repeatedly violate the dress code and/or refuse to comply with the dress code, the disciplinary team will apply the appropriate Sanborn code of conduct and restorative consequence(s).

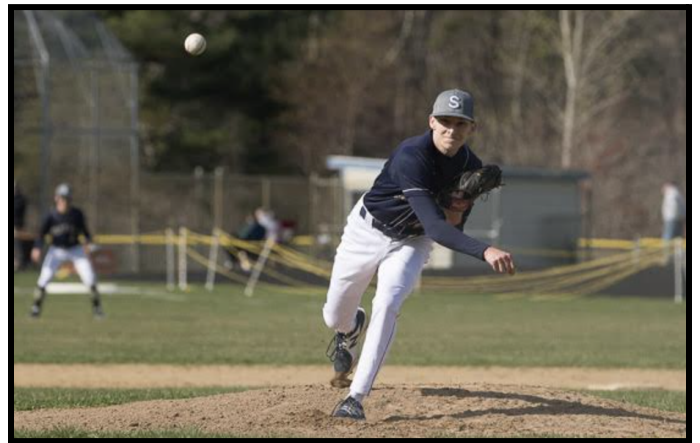

Sanborn Sky Watch Update

On April 13th, the New Hampshire Astronomical Society (NHAS) visited Sanborn to host a sky watch. There was an indoor presentation starting at 7 PM that detailed the objects that were visible in the sky that night. Paul Winalski, the man who gave the presentation, did a great job going in depth on each object. He also shared his own personal experiences with observing the universe. There were two planets visible through the telescopes that night, Mercury and Venus. Some of the other objects included Sirius, the brightest star in the sky; the Orion Nebula, part of Orion's sword; the Beehive Cluster, a cluster of stars millions of light years away; and the Double Cluster, two star clusters right next to each other.

Following the indoor presentation, the group traveled outside to the high jump pit next to the athletic fields. Four astronomy experts had telescopes set up and ready to observe some of the visible objects. You could tell they were very excited about their work and enjoyed sharing their knowledge with the rest of the group. Most of their telescopes had GPS tracking, where coordinates could be typed in to point the telescope in the exact direction of a desired object. One of the gentlemen brought a homemade telescope, mostly out of repurposed materials. Building telescopes is a hobby of his and he has made over a dozen to this point. Everybody had a great time looking at the variety of objects with magnification. At some points you could even see a satellite pass by while looking through the telescopes. It was an amazing experience and something that I hope we will be able to do again in the future.
